City Charter Amendments

“Government Structure” Amendment

VOTE YES

- Puts mayor in charge of city departments (so they’ll have one boss, not 14)
- Puts City Council in charge of legislation and oversight
- Operates just like federal, state and most municipal governments

“Public Safety” Amendment

VOTE NO

- Eliminates MPLS Police Department, police chief, and requirement for minimum number of police
- Replaces MPD with Public Safety Department based on untested “public health model”
- New department would report to 14 bosses (mayor and 13 council members)
- Backed by out-of-town monied interests promoting a police-free future
